PRESIDENCY'S CONCLUSIONS

1 The Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the European Community had the opportunity to meet on 23 May whilst they were together in Lisbon for the Conference on Assistance to the New Independent States. During their talks they considered the latest developments in the Yugoslav crisis, and in particular events in Bosnia and Hercegovina.

2 The problem of the refugees fleeing that Republic was a cause of particular concern, and the Ministers stated their governments' intention to support the aid programme drawn up by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR). The Community and its Member States' participation in this programme should be via the Community budget, together, with voluntary contributions by individual countries.

3 The Ministers moreover condemned most strongly all violations of the principles of international law regarding humanitarian aid in times of crisis or war, such as have taken place in Bosnia, and demanded that all parties involved respect those principles.

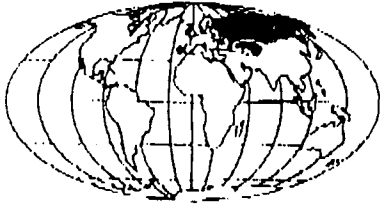
Humanitarian aid will be aimed primarily at ensuring that refugees do not have to move too far from their place of origin. This means that the aid will have its main effects in the territory of the former Yugoslavia. In this context, the reopening of Sarajevo airport is essential.

4 At the same time, following on from their declaration of 11 May, the Ministers reiterated that the principal responsibility for the continued deterioration of the situation in Bosnia and Hercegovina lies clearly with the Serbian authorities and the JNA under their control. With this in mind, the Ministers reviewed certain restrictive measures of a political or economic nature which would increase the international pressure on Belgrade, and the likelihood of its isolation, the aim being that the Belgrade authorities comply immediately and in full with the decisions of the United Nations Security Council and the commitments accepted in the framework of

the Peace Conference sponsored by the European Community, and in particular the talks on Bosnia held in Lisbon.

5 Such measures include and could go beyond those proposed by the Commission at the request of the Council of 11 May. They will be discussed in depth at a meeting of senior officials to be held on 26 May, with a view to preparing recommendations to Ministers.

6 The Ministers agreed that it would be highly desirable for the Presidency to maintain its contacts with non-member countries, including in particular the United States, but also Russia and the other members of the Commonwealth of Independent States, in order to coordinate the modalities of international pressure to be applied to Belgrade, and thus enhance the effectiveness of individual countries' action aimed at finding a peaceful political solution to the Yugoslav crisis.

ASSISTANCE TO THE NEW INDEPENDENT STATES
LISBON, 23/24 MAY 1992

FINAL STATEMENT

BY THE PRESIDENT IN OFFICE
OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES

1 As our conference draws to a close I should like to say again how much we have appreciated the presence of the distinguished representatives of the New Independent States, whose efforts we firmly support.

2 In this context I should like to stress the importance we place on respect for the CSCE principles as a fundamental component of the peaceful solution of the conflicts in which some of the States are involved, and we call on them to abstain from any action liable to threaten the stability which is necessary to the enormous tasks they already face.

3 Our aim in this Lisbon Conference, in which we have succeeded, was to give an unmistakable message of international solidarity, and to review the progress made so far in our assistance action, and the analysis and planning work which has been submitted to us.

Thus, briefly

- We have reviewed the process begun in Washington, and seen that the already considerable financial effort made has been strengthened; we have heard reports on the proceedings of the five working groups set up in January, and their respective conclusions should now serve as a guideline for future assistance programmes.

- Our assessment of short-term assistance, that is, humanitarian aid, can also be regarded as very positive. This is particularly the case for the emergency food aid programmes organized by the European Community, which also inspired an American initiative to constitute a counterpart fund by means of such action.

- We have had the opportunity to hear the representatives of the New Independent States themselves, who have reported on the progress they are making with reform, and have indicated their own priorities.

- Emphasis has been placed on the role that certain countries could play in triangular operations, and attention drawn to the benefits of drawing on the structural reform experiences of those countries which have already been through similar difficulties.

- We have launched initiatives in the field of nuclear safety, and stressed their priority nature. In this context we welcome the initiatives of the United States and the European Community and its Member States, and of other donor countries and international organizations, aimed at improving the safety of reactors of Soviet construction.

- The European Community has announced initiatives to encourage partnership between firms active in the health, culture, education, business and sports sectors; and voluntary service schemes will encourage Europeans to take an active role in the transition process to which the New Independent States have committed themselves.

- Finally, I am very pleased to announce the conclusion of negotiations between the Communities, the United States, Japan and the Russian Federation, establishing the International Science and Technology Centre, which will help integrate scientists from this area into the international scientific community. We have noted that other donor countries also intend to participate in the centre.

4 Allow me now to stress the importance of the exchange of views which has resulted from these two days of discussions.

- The statement by the Managing Director of the IMF was of particular interest. He described to us the accession process of the New Independent States, and macro-economic developments.

- Stress has been laid on the fact that the New Independent States should develop their capacity to meet their own food needs, but that it is essential that in the event of a food shortfall next winter, the principal donor countries coordinate their efforts on the spot.

- In this context, the question of technical assistance is of particular significance. It must be the essential component of future programmes of assistance to the New Independent States, including in the energy, health and housing sectors. In the specific area of housing, programmes could also be aimed at facilitating the rapid reintegration of the military forces of the Independent States still stationed outside their own territories.

- Inter-regional cooperation was considered to be of particular importance, to be developed as a vehicle for political, commercial, economic, financial and monetary cooperation, in particular in seeking solutions to problems whose scale is greater than the purely national.

5 Finally, we have considered the future co-ordination of assistance, and reached the following conclusions about our aims:

- First and foremost, assistance must be flexible and pragmatic; its aim must be efficiency. On the spot co-ordination is essential.

- The New Independent States should gradually assume responsibility for future co-ordination, in order to improve the consistency between assistance programmes and the States' own implementation of reforms.

- Longer term co-ordination will require a central role to be played by the international organizations. This could, in principle, be effected on a regional basis.

- We have also considered exploring the establishment of assistance co-ordination groups, as necessary, combining interested donors, the appropriate international organizations, and the country or countries concerned. This does not rule out the possibility of certain areas being dealt with across the board. Groups such as these should be flexible, and temporary.

- All in all, the international co-ordination of assistance which was begun in Washington should now assume a new form, which should be implemented gradually between now and our October meeting in Japan, to which we are delighted to have been invited. We must congratulate the Working groups set up in January, whose work should be complete by the Autumn, although we feel that full use should be made of the groups as long as they serve their expected objectives.

6 I should like to thank you all for coming to the Lisbon Conference: it has been the opportunity for new signs of solidarity and a more forceful message of encouragement to the New Independent States, whose efforts to transform their society have been recognized and applauded by us all.

I should like to conclude with a message of hope to the peoples of the New Independent States, and to convey to them that their peace and progress are objectives which are as close to our hearts as they are to theirs.

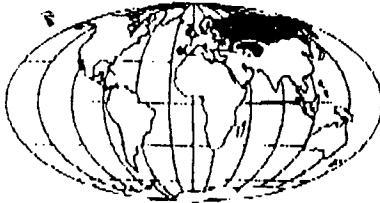

ASSISTANCE TO THE NEW INDEPENDENT STATES
LISBON, 23/24 MAY 1992

FINAL STATEMENT

BY THE PRESIDENT IN OFFICE
OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES

1 As our conference draws to a close I should like to say again how much we have appreciated the presence of the distinguished representatives of the New Independent States, whose efforts we firmly support.

2 In this context I should like to stress the importance we place on respect for the CSCE principles as a fundamental component of the peaceful solution of the conflicts in which some of the States are involved, and we call on them to abstain from any action liable to threaten the stability which is necessary to the enormous tasks they already face.

3 Our aim in this Lisbon Conference, in which we have succeeded, was to give an unmistakable message of international solidarity, and to review the progress made so far in our assistance action, and the analysis and planning work which has been submitted to us.

Thus, briefly

- We have reviewed the process begun in Washington, and seen that the already considerable financial effort made has been strengthened; we have heard reports on the proceedings of the five working groups set up in January, and their respective conclusions should now serve as a guideline for future assistance programmes.

- Our assessment of short-term assistance, that is, humanitarian aid, can also be regarded as very positive. This is particularly the case for the emergency food aid programmes organized by the European Community, which also inspired an American initiative to constitute a counterpart fund by means of such action.

- We have had the opportunity to hear the representatives of the New Independent States themselves, who have reported on the progress they are making with reform, and have indicated their own priorities.

- Emphasis has been placed on the role that certain countries could play in triangular operations, and attention drawn to the benefits of drawing on the structural reform experiences of those countries which have already been through similar difficulties.

We have launched initiatives in the field of nuclear safety, and stressed their priority nature. In this context we welcome the initiatives of the United States and the European Community and its Member States, and of other donor countries and international organizations, aimed at improving the safety of reactors of Soviet construction.

- The European Community has announced initiatives to encourage partnership between firms active in the health, culture, education, business and sports sectors; and voluntary service schemes will encourage Europeans to take an active role in the transition process to which the New Independent States have committed themselves.

- Finally, I am very pleased to announce the conclusion of negotiations between the Communities, the United States, Japan and the Russian Federation, establishing the International Science and Technology Centre, which will help integrate scientists from this area into the international scientific community. We have noted that other donor countries also intend to participate in the centre.

4 Allow me now to stress the importance of the exchange of views which has resulted from these two days of discussions.

- The statement by the Managing Director of the IMF was of particular interest. He described to us the accession process of the New Independent States, and macro-economic developments.

- Stress has been laid on the fact that the New Independent States should develop their capacity to meet their own food needs, but that it is essential that in the event of a food shortfall next winter, the principal donor countries coordinate their efforts on the spot.

- In this context, the question of technical assistance is of particular significance. It must be the essential component of future programmes of assistance to the New Independent States, including in the energy, health and housing sectors. In the specific area of housing, programmes could also be aimed at facilitating the rapid reintegration of the military forces of the Independent States still stationed outside their own territories.

- Inter-regional cooperation was considered to be of particular importance, to be developed as a vehicle for political, commercial, economic, financial and monetary cooperation, in particular in seeking solutions to problems whose scale is greater than the purely national.

5 Finally, we have considered the future co-ordination of assistance, and reached the following conclusions about our aims:

- First and foremost, assistance must be flexible and pragmatic; its aim must be efficiency. On the spot co-ordination is essential.

- The New Independent States should gradually assume responsibility for future co-ordination, in order to improve the consistency between assistance programmes and the States' own implementation of reforms.

- Longer term co-ordination will require a central role to be played by the international organizations. This could, in principle, be effected on a regional basis.

- We have also considered exploring the establishment of assistance co-ordination groups, as necessary, combining interested donors, the appropriate international organizations, and the country or countries concerned. This does not rule out the possibility of certain areas being dealt with across the board. Groups such as these should be flexible, and temporary.

- All in all, the international co-ordination of assistance which was begun in Washington should now assume a new form, which should be implemented gradually between now and our October meeting in Japan, to which we are delighted to have been invited. We must congratulate the Working groups set up in January, whose work should be complete by the Autumn, although we feel that full use should be made of the groups as long as they serve their expected objectives.

6 I should like to thank you all for coming to the Lisbon Conference: it has been the opportunity for new signs of solidarity and a more forceful message of encouragement to the New Independent States, whose efforts to transform their society have been recognized and applauded by us all.

I should like to conclude with a message of hope to the peoples of the New Independent States, and to convey to them that their peace and progress are objectives which are as close to our hearts as they are to theirs.

PRESIDENCY'S CONCLUSIONS

- 1 The Ministers of Foreign Affairs of the European Community had the opportunity to meet on 23 May whilst they were together in Lisbon for the Conference on Assistance to the New Independent States. During their talks they considered the latest developments in the Yugoslav crisis, and in particular events in Bosnia and Hercegovina.
- 2 The problem of the refugees fleeing that Republic was a cause of particular concern, and the Ministers stated their governments' intention to support the aid programme drawn up by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR). The Community and its Member States' participation in this programme should be via the Community budget, together, with voluntary contributions by individual countries.
- 3 The Ministers moreover condemned most strongly all violations of the principles of international law regarding humanitarian aid in times of crisis or war, such as have taken place in Bosnia, and demanded that all parties involved respect those principles.

Humanitarian aid will be aimed primarily at ensuring that refugees do not have to move too far from their place of origin. This means that the aid will have its main effects in the territory of the former Yugoslavia. In this context, the reopening of Sarajevo airport is essential.
- 4 At the same time, following on from their declaration of 11 May, the Ministers reiterated that the principal responsibility for the continued deterioration of the situation in Bosnia and Hercegovina lies clearly with the Serbian authorities and the JNA under their control. With this in mind, the Ministers reviewed certain restrictive measures of a political or economic nature which would increase the international pressure on Belgrade, and the likelihood of its isolation, the aim being that the Belgrade authorities comply immediately and in full with the decisions of the United Nations Security Council and the commitments accepted in the framework of

the Peace Conference sponsored by the European Community, and in particular the talks on Bosnia held in Lisbon.

5 Such measures include and could go beyond those proposed by the Commission at the request of the Council of 11 May. They will be discussed in depth at a meeting of senior officials to be held on 26 May, with a view to preparing recommendations to Ministers.

6 The Ministers agreed that it would be highly desirable for the Presidency to maintain its contacts with non-member countries, including in particular the United States, but also Russia and the other members of the Commonwealth of Independent States, in order to coordinate the modalities of international pressure to be applied to Belgrade, and thus enhance the effectiveness of individual countries' action aimed at finding a peaceful political solution to the Yugoslav crisis.

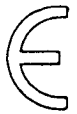

BACKGROUND SHEET: START PROTOCOL

- o On May 23, 1992, in Lisbon, Portugal, the Republic of Byelarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, Ukraine, and the United States of America signed a new Protocol to the START Treaty. Signing for their respective states were:
 - U.S. Secretary of State James A. Baker, III,
 - Byelarus Foreign Minister Petr Kravchenka,
 - Kazakh State Counselor for Strategic Affairs Zhukeyev,
 - Russian Foreign Minister Andrey Kozyrev, and
 - Ukrainian Foreign Minister Anatoliy Zlenko.
- o The Protocol, which is subject to ratification along with the Treaty, is designed to recognize the altered political situation following the breakup of the former Soviet Union.
- o The Protocol makes Byelarus, Kazakhstan, Russia, and Ukraine Parties to the START Treaty.
 - All strategic offensive arms are based on the territory of these four states and all declared START-related facilities are located there.
 - The four states will make the necessary implementing arrangements among themselves to carry out their responsibilities under START.
- o The new Protocol also obligates Byelarus, Kazakhstan, and Ukraine to adhere to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty as non-nuclear weapons states Parties in the shortest possible time, and to immediately begin to take the necessary steps toward this end.
- o Accompanying the new Protocol are letters from the Chairman of the Supreme Soviet of Byelarus, the President of Kazakhstan, and the President of Ukraine to President Bush.
 - These legally-binding letters obligate the three states involved to eliminate all nuclear weapons and all strategic offensive arms from their territories within the seven-year period provided for reductions under the START Treaty.
- o As a result of the signature of the new Protocol and the accompanying letters, the United States will proceed toward START ratification, with the goal of having the START Treaty enter into force later this year.

BACKGROUND SHEET: START PROTOCOL

- o On May 23, 1992, in Lisbon, Portugal, the Republic of Byelarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, Ukraine, and the United States of America signed a new Protocol to the START Treaty. Signing for their respective states were:
 - U.S. Secretary of State James A. Baker, III,
 - Byelarus Foreign Minister Petr Kravchenka,
 - Kazakh State Counselor for Strategic Affairs Zhukeyev,
 - Russian Foreign Minister Andrey Kozyrev, and
 - Ukrainian Foreign Minister Anatoliy Zlenko.
- o The Protocol, which is subject to ratification along with the Treaty, is designed to recognize the altered political situation following the breakup of the former Soviet Union.
- o The Protocol makes Byelarus, Kazakhstan, Russia, and Ukraine Parties to the START Treaty.
 - All strategic offensive arms are based on the territory of these four states and all declared START-related facilities are located there.
 - The four states will make the necessary implementing arrangements among themselves to carry out their responsibilities under START.
- o The new Protocol also obligates Byelarus, Kazakhstan, and Ukraine to adhere to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty as non-nuclear weapons states Parties in the shortest possible time, and to immediately begin to take the necessary steps toward this end.
- o Accompanying the new Protocol are letters from the Chairman of the Supreme Soviet of Byelarus, the President of Kazakhstan, and the President of Ukraine to President Bush.
 - These legally-binding letters obligate the three states involved to eliminate all nuclear weapons and all strategic offensive arms from their territories within the seven-year period provided for reductions under the START Treaty.
- o As a result of the signature of the new Protocol and the accompanying letters, the United States will proceed toward START ratification, with the goal of having the START Treaty enter into force later this year.

Treaty Between the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on the Reduction and Limitation of Strategic Offensive Arms (START Treaty)

START negotiations began in 1982. The United States sought a treaty that would provide for "deep reductions" in U.S. and Soviet strategic offensive nuclear forces, equal limits on the two sides, and "effective verification." Talks were suspended in 1983, when the Soviets walked out in protest over U.S. intermediate-range missile deployments in Europe. Negotiations resumed in 1985 and Presidents George Bush and Boris Yeltsin concluded them in July 1991. On May 23, 1992, a protocol was signed between the U.S. and the four Soviet successor states that have weapons covered by START -- Russia, Belarus, Kazakhstan and Ukraine. Taken together, these documents outline complex and often costly procedures that the nations must follow to remain in compliance with START I.

**PROTOCOL TO THE TREATY BETWEEN
THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND
THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS ON
THE REDUCTION AND LIMITATION OF STRATEGIC OFFENSIVE ARMS**

The Republic of Byelarus (1 Spelling as appears in the original English Text of Protocol. In other documents, the revised official spelling "Belarus" is used.), the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, Ukraine, and the United States of America, hereinafter referred to as the Parties,

Reaffirming their support for the Treaty Between the United States of America and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on the Reduction and Limitation of Strategic Offensive Arms of July 31, 1991, hereinafter referred to as the Treaty,

Recognizing the altered political situation resulting from the replacement of the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics with a number of independent states,

Recalling the commitment of the member states of the Commonwealth of Independent States that the nuclear weapons of the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics will be maintained under the safe, secure, and reliable control of a single unified authority,

Desiring to facilitate implementation of the Treaty in this altered situation,

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I

The Republic of Byelarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, and Ukraine, as successor states of the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republic in connection with the Treaty, shall assume the obligations of the former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics under the Treaty.

ARTICLE II

The Republic of Byelarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, and Ukraine shall make such arrangements among themselves as are required to implement the Treaty's limits and restrictions; to allow functioning of the verification provisions of the Treaty equally and consistently throughout the territory of the Republic of Byelarus, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the Russian Federation, and Ukraine; and to allocate costs.
