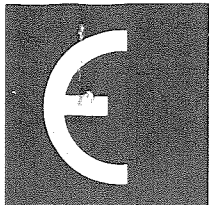
Article premier

Les Etats membres mettent à la disposition de la Communauté, aux conditions précisées ci-après, un montant jusqu'à concurrence de 2.333 Ecus. Ces fonds sont exclusivement destinés à compléter la couverture des dépenses de l'exercice budgétaire 1984.

Article 2

Les demandes de la Commission seront adressées à tous les Etats membres, chacun de ceux-ci contribuant à l'opération envisagée conformément à sa quote-part dans l'assiette harmonisée de TVA de la Communauté, à savoir :

**EXTRACTS FROM A STATEMENT BY VICE-PRESIDENT TUGENDHAT TO THE
BUDGET COMMITTEE OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT ON 18 APRIL 1984**

FINANCING OF THE 1984 BUDGET

1. The President of the Commission informed the Parliament at its plenary session in March that it would shortly be making proposals concerning the financing of the 1984 budget.
2. Following the decisions which the Council of Ministers took on agricultural prices for 1984/85 and on the reform of the Common Agricultural Policy the Commission has now been able to estimate the volume of the insufficiency of both credits and resources for 1984. After due reflection it is today presenting both to the Parliament and to the Council its proposal for dealing with the situation. Details of the proposal are contained in a communication being circulated now.
3. The Commission's analysis of the potential needs of the Community in 1984 is as follows.

For agriculture we estimate that a further 2131 MECU will be

in payments. These reductions will be achieved entirely, or virtually entirely, without affecting the level of commitments in the 1984 budget. They will be obtained by not recommitting in the course of the year certain cancelled commitments from the past in the Regional and Social Funds; by the introduction of certain delays in the dates of payments under the structural funds, including certain payments to Member States under FEOGA Guidance; and by a particularly strict use of carried-over credits from 1983 and credits in the chapter 100 reserve for research.

7. On this basis the request which the Commission is making for additional resources will amount to 2333 MECU.
8. Two initiatives from the Commission are required, a proposal for a legal base and a preliminary draft supplementary and a rectifying budget. It seems to the Commission logical to present the proposal for a legal base first. The communication put forward today contains this proposal under article 235 of the Treaty. The Parliament is invited to give its opinion on it. I hope it will be able to do so at its session in May. The budgetary instrument will follow later in the year.
9. In considering the nature of the proposal to bring forward Commission has examined a number of options. I do not propose now to explain why some were discarded but can do so in reply to questions if necessary. Proposal retained by the Commission is that Member States should put the necessary funds at the disposal of the Commission in the form of a loan which would bear interest at the market rate. The Commission suggests that the division of the loan among the Member States should be done on the basis of their shares in the harmonised VAT assiette of the Community. And that the loan, which of course would be budgetised should be repaid in 8 half yearly instalments commencing on 30 June 1986, the year during which we anticipate new Community own resources will be available.
